Timacuan's Signature Hole # 2



Timacuan's signature hole, #2, offers many different looks. This hole is a true test for any skill level no matter what set of tees you are playing.

Playing from the men's blue tees (top left), it can play up to a 200-yard carry just to negotiate the water hazard.



A view from the men's white tees (middle picture) and the ladies green tees (bottom picture) both illustrate how challenging this tee shot can be.

Once you find your way to the fairway, the fun begins. The second shot is equally demanding with a 150 to 200 yard carry over yet a second water hazard to a green that slopes from front to back. A large bunker guards the left side of this green, which makes shots tend to stray right.



This hole was once ranked one of the toughest holes in Central Florida. Not only is #2 challenging and fun to play, but it also offers a beautiful look from

Rules of the Game

Can I practice before or during a tournament round?

Rule 7. Practice

Definition

The "course" is the whole area within which play is permitted (see [Rule 33-2](#)).

7-1. Before or Between Rounds

a. Match Play

On any day of a match play competition, a player may practice on the competition course before a round.

b. Stroke Play

On any day of a stroke competition or play-off, a competitor shall not practice on the competition course or test the surface of any putting green on the course before a round or play-off. When two or more rounds of a stroke competition are to be played over consecutive days, practice between those rounds on any competition course remaining to be played, or testing the surface of any putting green on such course, is prohibited.

Exception: Practice putting or chipping on or near the first teeing ground before starting a round or play-off is permitted.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE 7-1b:

Disqualification. Note: The Committee may in the conditions of a competition ([Rule 33-1](#)) prohibit practice on the competition course on any day of a match play competition or permit practice on the competition course or part of the course ([Rule 33-2c](#)) on any day of or between rounds of a stroke competition.

7-2. During Round

A player shall not play a practice stroke either during the play of a hole or between the play of two holes except that, between the play of two holes, the player may practice putting or chipping on or near the putting green of the hole last played, any practice putting green or the teeing ground of the next hole to be played in the round, provided such practice stroke is not played from a hazard and does not unduly delay play ([Rule 6-7](#)).

Strokes played in continuing the play of a hole, the result of which has been decided, are not practice strokes.

Exception: When play has been suspended by the Committee, a player may, prior to resumption of play, practice (a) as provided in this Rule, (b) anywhere other than on the competition course and (c) as otherwise permitted by the Committee.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE 7-2: Match play—Loss of hole; Stroke play—Two strokes.

In the event of a breach between the play of two holes, the penalty applies to the next hole.

Note 1: A practice swing is not a practice stroke and may be taken at any place, provided the player does not breach the Rules.

Note 2: The Committee may prohibit practice on or near the putting green of the hole last played

What's Cookin? Paul Baio, Head Chef

Chocolate Chip Cookies



All purpose Flour-2 ¼ cups

Baking Soda-One Tea-spoon

Salt-One Teaspoon

Sugar-3/4 cup

Brown Sugar-3/4 cup

Butter (Soft)-1 cup

Vanilla-One teaspoon

Eggs—2

Chocolate Chips- 2 ½ Cups

Add all dry ingredients in a large bowl and mix, add soft butter, eggs and Vanilla, fold mixture until smooth and pasty then add chocolate chips and mix



Spoon out on cookie sheet, wax paper should be used, bake in a preheated oven at 300 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes or until they look toasty on the top, remove and let cool, then eat and Enjoy.

Turf Talk

Barry Shuman, Golf Course Superintendent



Spring has already arrived and the weather has begun to get warm. The temperatures have been reaching the low 90's and the Bermuda grass is beginning to grow much more aggressively. When this occurs, we are starting to transition from Ryegrass (winter grass) back to the Bermuda grass, which is the dominant grass in this climate or temperature zone.

The greens have been in very good condition this year and, hopefully, we can continue maintaining them to these standards. In order to do so, we will be performing some cultural practices, which consist of verticutting and topdressing. Verticutting involves the removal of dead organic matter that accumulates in the area right under

the leaf blades, which eventually turns into thatch. It also helps with keeping the grain of the grass to a minimum. Topdressing benefits the greens in several ways:

1. Helps with healing un-repaired ball marks.
2. Helps with establishment of a smoother putting surface.
3. Reduces the buildup of organic matter in the soil profile which affects the distribution of nutrients, water, and oxygen to the root system.

Just a little advance notice to all of you that we will be aerifying the golf course on May 27th and 28th. The course and practice facility will be closed for those two days.

A reminder to all of you to please repair ball marks, fill divots, and rake the bunkers for there is always someone playing behind you. Also, juniors, let me remind you to walk down the cart path on #7 instead of through the bunker to reach the green. As always, thanks to everyone for your support.

Handicap Report

Bob Manuel, Handicap Committee



To Post, or not to post, that is the question.

Which scores do you have to post for your USGA Handicap Index and which scores are you not allowed to post? It's certainly not as big a dilemma as Shakespeare's Hamlet faced, but it's still an important question that you must answer.

Here are the basic guidelines. Generally, you should post all scores no matter where you play. But there are a few specific rules to follow in particular cases:

- Post your score when you play at least 13 holes. On the holes you didn't play, record a par plus any handicap strokes you would have received. For example, you don't play the 18th hole. For someone playing the green tees, the 18th is the 12th hardest hole. A player receiving 30 handicap strokes would get two strokes here so record a score of par (4) plus 2 handicap strokes for a hole score of 6. You can do this for as many as 5 holes not played.
- Post all nine hole scores. The computer in the pro shop will assign the proper rating and slope, and when you have two separate nine hole scores, they will be combined and included in your scoring history.
- If you pick up on a hole, include the score

you most likely would have made but no higher than the maximum number you are allowed under the ESC system.

- You must play by the principles of the Rules of Golf in order to post your score. For example, if you use a mulligan, you aren't playing a hole under the Rules of Golf so treat it as a hole not played and record par plus any handicap strokes you would have received.
- Match play can sometimes be posted if you have at least 13 holes with legitimate scores

When NOT to post scores:

- If you played fewer than 13 holes (except for nine-hole scores)
- When you play in a competition limiting the types of clubs used, such as a one-club or irons-only event
- When you play in a scramble or different situation rules on each hole
- When you have declared a round to be a "Practice Round" before beginning play

Miscellaneous hints and suggestions:

It is each player's responsibility to insure that the correct scores are posted into the handicap system. Each of us should check the computer in the pro shop on a regular basis to insure that: the correct

score is recorded; the tees played are correctly reflected; the correct date is indicated; away scores are shown with an "A"; and the course rating and slope are correctly recorded. If corrections need to be made, check with the pro shop personnel. Suggestion: Use one scorecard for the foursome. This will help to insure that each player's score gets posted. If using two or more scorecards, remind fellow competitors to turn in their cards before leaving the course.

The USGA web site is www.usga.org and is an excellent and easy source for information on the Rules of Golf and the Handicap System. You can go to www.ghin.com (Golf Handicap Information Network) and look up your current Handicap Index and past scoring history. You can also look at other players' scoring history at this site.
